ORDINANCE NO. _____

An Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 31, General Offenses.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF FLINT:

Sec. 1. An Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 31, General Offenses, Article I, In General, by amending Section 31-10, Disorderly Conduct and Disorderly Persons, which shall read in its entirety as follows:

§31-10. DISORDERLY CONDUCT, ASSAULT AND BATTERY, AND DISORDERLY PERSONS.

(A) Disorderly Conduct. Any Person who does any of the following is guilty of a misdemeanor:

- (1) Engages in any fight in a public place, except when doing so in defense of self or another individual;
- (2) Remains in any public place after its regular closing hours after being told by an authorized person to leave;
- (3) Conducts himself in any public place, or joins with one or more persons in a public place, and he or she knows or should know that, singly or together with others with whom he or she has joined, is unreasonably obstructing the free and uninterrupted passage of the public along any street or sidewalk. This subsection shall not be interpreted to conflict with the regulations of the National Labor Relations Board regarding picketing in labor disputes;
- (4) Persists in disturbing the public peace and quiet by loud or aggressive conduct, after having been clearly informed by Persons affected that he or she is in fact unreasonably causing a disturbance. Notice need not be given when such Persons affected reasonably believe that to do so would constitute a risk to their personal safety;
- (5) Persists in disturbing the peace and orderly conduct of any meeting of a public body or any meeting open to the general public by any conduct or communication that inflicts injury, tends to incite an immediate breach of peace, or prevents the peaceful and orderly conduct of the meeting after having been clearly informed that he or she is in fact unreasonably causing a disturbance;
- (6) Knowingly transports any Person, for consideration or the offer of consideration, to a place where prostitution, gambling, or illegal sale of alcoholic Liquor or a Controlled Substance is carried on, for the purpose of enabling the Person to be a customer in any of those activities;
- (7) Knowingly harasses any other Person. Harass is defined as (i) any repeated nonverbal conduct that is specifically intended to frighten, embarrass, or anger the Person or Persons who are the object of that conduct, (ii) the Person accused has reason to know his or her

actions will likely produce those reactions, or (iii) any repeated verbal communication that inflicts injury or incites an immediate breach of peace;

(8) Urinates or defecates on any public street or sidewalk, or on the floor of any building open to the public, or any other place in view of the public not specifically designated for that purpose;

(9) Throws any object from any moving vehicle, and he or she knows or should know that damage is likely to result to a person or property, directly or indirectly.

(10) Knowingly destroys, damages, or defaces, or removes any public property or other property not his or her own;

(11) Summons, without good reason, the Police department, Fire Department, any public or private ambulance, or any similar service, to go to any address where the service call is not needed;

(12) Intentionally makes or causes to be made any open exposure of the human male or female genitals, pubic area, buttocks, or female breast in any public place any building open to or frequented by the public, or any other place which is open to the public view;

(13) Makes, aids or assists in making any riot, disturbance, or improper diversion;

(14) Aids or assists in collecting a crowd for any unlawful purpose;

(15) Commits any breach of the peace; or

(16) Loiters, frequents, or remains on or in any public place or private property for the purpose of unlawfully using, possessing, offering sale, selling, furnishing, or dispensing any controlled substance or drug paraphernalia.

(B) Assault and Battery. Any person who:

(1) Assaults or assaults and batters an individual is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine or not more than \$500.00, or both.

(2) Assaults or assaults and batters his or her spouse or former spouse, an individual with whom he or she has or has had a dating relationship, an individual with whom he or she has had a child in common, or a resident or former resident of his or her household, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

(C) THREATS AGAINST LOCAL PUBLIC OFFICIALS: ANY PERSON WHO MAKES A THREAT TO KILL OR PHYSICALLY INJURE ANY PUBLIC OFFICIAL OR CAUSE PROPERTY DAMAGE TO PROPERTY OWNED BY A PUBLIC OFFICIAL IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR.

(D) As used in this section:

(1) *Controlled substance* shall have the same meaning as in §31-22.

(2) *Drug paraphernalia* shall have the same meaning as in §31-22.

(3) *Dating relationship* means frequent, intimate associations primarily characterized by the expectation of affectional involvement. This term does not include a casual relationship or an ordinary fraternization between 2 individuals in a business or social context.

(4) **LOCAL PUBLIC OFFICIAL MEANS AN ELECTED OR APPOINTED OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT.**

(5) **THREAT MEANS THE EXPRESSION OF AN INTENT TO COMMIT AN ACT OF UNLAWFUL VIOLENCE TO A PARTICULAR INDIVIDUAL, INDIVIDUALS, OR THEIR PROPERTY, WITHOUT REGARD AS TO WHETHER THE MAKER OF THE THREAT ACTUALLY INTENDS TO CARRY OUT THE THREAT.**

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment.

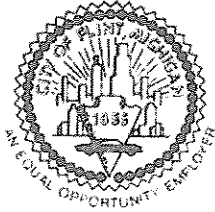

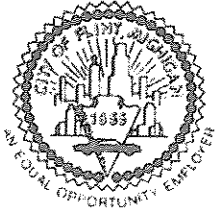
Case Overview:

PC 24-04 was originally scheduled to be heard at the February 27, 2024, Planning Commission Meeting, but was withdrawn and postponed to a future date as the subject petition originally sought approval to partially vacate and reconfigure E. Dewey St; the proposed partial vacation and reconfiguration of E Dewey St would have resulted in the City having to submit a second vacation petition as none of the necessary removal of the public utility infrastructure underneath the street would have been able to occur, rendering the initial vacation petition ineffective.

To entirely vacate the subject segment of E. Dewey St and remove all public utilities underneath of it, all the properties south-adjacent to the subject segment of E. Dewey St need to be in ownership of Friends of Berston or the City of Flint, else public right-of-way (street) access and public utility services would still need to be provided to 760 E. Dewey St; the property located 760 E. Dewey St has been acquired by Friends of Berston and the petition to entirely vacate the subject segment of E. Dewey St can proceed (see **Exhibit C**).

Property Background:

The segment of E. Dewey St subject to the pending vacation petition is a local one-way street that is located between N. Saginaw St and North St, south of the Berston Fieldhouse complex and is part of the Parkland and Parkland No. 2 Subdivisions, which were originally part of one of several Indigenous Reservations that bound the Flint River.

Planning Overview:

The City of Flint is seeking a positive recommendation from the Planning Commission to City Council for approval by resolution, to vacate E. Dewey St, between N. Saginaw St and North St (see **Exhibit A**).

The petition to vacate E. Dewey St is related to the expansion and redevelopment occurring at 3300 N Saginaw St and 3319 North St, the site of Berston Fieldhouse (see **Exhibit B**). The vacated street will be combined with the parcels that make up the block that is bound by E. Dewey St and W. Jamieson St, between N Saginaw St and North St (excluding the properties located at 3200 & 3208 N Saginaw St), and subsequently will be combined into a single parcel that contains Bertson Fieldhouse and its facilities (see **Exhibit B**).

At the intersection of E. Dewey St and N. Saginaw St, from said intersection to the western lot line of the former Lot 23 of Parkland Subdivision, will be utilized as means of vehicular ingress and egress to the proposed new parking facilities for the Berston Fieldhouse complex (see **Exhibit A**).

Public Utility Infrastructure

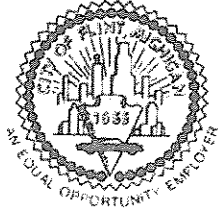
Currently there exists water, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer infrastructure along E. Dewey St that will be removed upon approval of the subject vacation petition (see **Exhibit D**); a utility easement will be retained from the intersection of E. Dewey St and N. Saginaw St eastward to approximately the western lot line of the former Lot 27 of Parkland Subdivision (see **Exhibit A**).

Private Utility Infrastructure

Several private utility services (gas, electric, telecommunications) exist along the subject section of E. Dewey St to be vacated (see **Exhibit D**). It has been confirmed with staff that the removal of some of these services has already occurred and that their removal and the removal of services still in place will have no impact on the surrounding area.

Area To Be Vacated

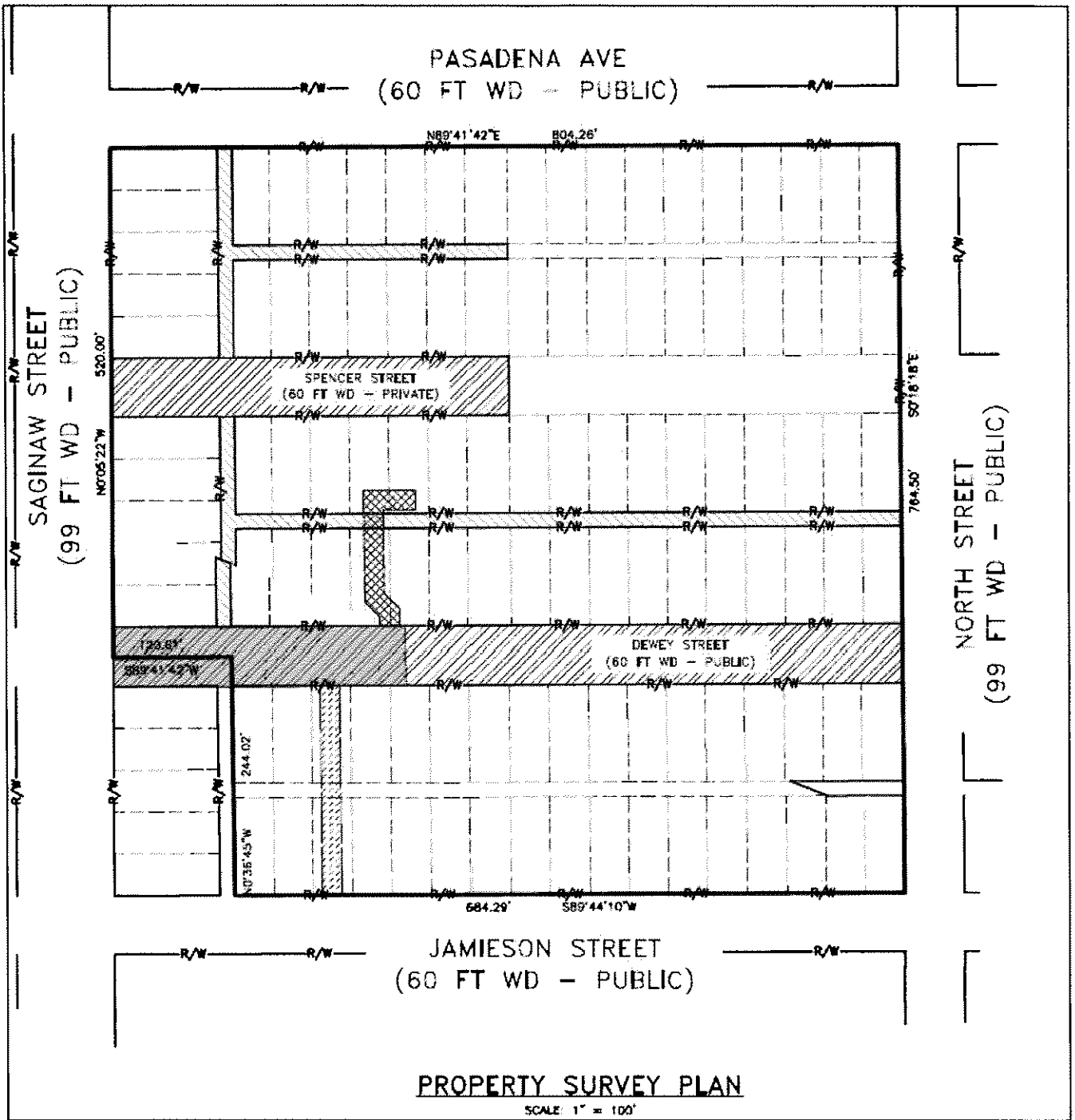

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

Catholic Charities of Shiawassee and Genesee Counties (CCSGC) is located at 901 Chippewa Street, Flint, Michigan 48503. The second center is at 120 W. Exchange Street, Suite 300, Owosso, Michigan 48867. Providing Mental Health Services focused on Evidence-Based Practices is essential for the overall health and safety of the underserved population in Genesee County is essential to turn these negative trends around.

Funding Purpose: Catholic Charities of Shiawassee and Genesee Counties (CCSGC) is seeking funds to hire a Clinical Director to meet the increased need to serve the uninsured, underinsured, and marginalized population of Genesee County. These funds will supplement the cost of our other therapists to meet the demands of credential requirements attached to state and federal funding sources for essential services. We will fund an Intake Specialist to increase access to services and decrease wait times.

Genesee County has been designated as a Health Professional Shortage Area for Mental Health, as reported by U.S. DHHS. This requires CCSGC to increase wages and find creative ways to market to recruit new staff. CCSGC is seeking funds to hire a Clinical Director to meet the increased need to serve the uninsured, underinsured, and marginalized population of Genesee County. These funds will supplement the cost of our other therapists to meet the demands of credential requirements attached to state and federal funding sources for essential services. We will fund an Intake Specialist to increase access to services and decrease wait times.

Mental health-related needs in the city of Flint were already higher due to the community-wide trauma experienced because of the Flint Water Crisis. The COVID-19 pandemic increased stress and anxiety levels within the whole population and public health actions, such as social distancing have led to increased feelings of isolation and loneliness, further adding to emotional and mental health challenges. Seniors were disproportionately affected by the pandemic. Genesee County has been designated as a Health Professional Shortage Area for Mental Health as reported by U.S. DHHS, which has affected senior citizens with Medicare to not be able to access Mental Health services in this county. Another concern is for the uninsured and underinsured population which has increased due to unemployment concerns due to the pandemic.

Mental health was identified by community residents completing the 2022 CHNA Community Resident Survey as the second most important health problem in the community, as 42% of respondents to the survey question identified "Access to mental and behavioral health services" as one of their top three health problems. When Genesee County residents were asked which health issues they are dealing with, 45% identified stress and 33% identified mental health problems such

as depression, anxiety, etc. Regarding social isolation, 24% of residents indicated they “sometimes” felt isolated from others, and 18% “often” felt isolated from others.

Genesee County is in dire need of additional Mental Health service providers. Catholic Charities is actively serving clients with Medicaid, Medicare, private insurance, and self-pay services on a sliding scale. Our mission to serve the poor and care for residents in Flint and surrounding areas leads us to not turn away clients based on ability to pay. We serve all individuals regardless of age, race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or disability, many of whom are uninsured, underserved, and marginalized. Many individuals and families who live in poverty are disproportionately of minority racial status.

Data from the largest mental health survey of the Flint, Michigan community indicate that one in five adults, or roughly 13,600 people, were estimated to have clinical depression, and one in four, or 15,000 people, were estimated to have PTSD five years after the water crisis began, as reported by Duke University. These effects on Mental Health have been exasperated by the effects of the Covid19 pandemic. Mental Illness has been correlated to many negative outcomes in regard to homelessness, substance abuse, all-cause mortality, employment, Emergency Department use, lack of natural supports, suicidal death, etc.

Program History: Catholic Charities of Flint Michigan assistance programs - most of the Catholic Charities resources available in Shiawassee and Genesee County are targeted at more so-called basic needs, such as passing out free food, holiday assistance, and counseling. However, the agency may be able to refer qualified low-income families to other assistance programs in the region, including homeless prevention/rent help, funds for paying heating bills, and more. From time to time the Flint MI Catholic Charities may have some limited direct financial aid for those bills and costs. The non-profit both provides help and creates hope for all those in need, serving all people regardless of faith, age, or background.

Community Closet - Set up as a comfortable "shopping experience" we offer gently used clothing and shoes at no cost to low-income families in need. Growing kids need new clothes each year! Purchasing new clothing can be a hardship for families who are struggling financially. We are here to help kids feel confident and happy by providing quality clothing to wear to school.

Linen Closet - Most of us take blankets, sheets, and towels for granted but for many, these would be considered luxury items. While supplies last we aim to furnish families with the ability to tuck their children into a warm bed every night.

Personal Needs - Through this program, items such as toothpaste, shampoo, diapers, laundry soap, razors and toilet paper are made available to those in need. Clients may receive products once a month, based on availability.

Food Pantry - We are dedicated to serving those in need in our area by supplementing their monthly groceries. Our families include the working poor, retired seniors and those struggling to feed babies and small children.

Section I: BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

This resolution is to allocate \$400,000 of Opioid Settlement Funds to the City of Flint's Office of Public Health (OPH). The OPH and its Public Health Navigation program, unique to the City of Flint, was established in 2018 to respond to the negative impacts of the Flint Water Crisis. Since then, the OPH is the main point of contact for nearly every person who comes into Flint City Hall, providing customer service, Spanish-language translations, resources and assistance in navigating internal and external services. In addition, the OPH distributes, tracks and orders water filters at City Hall, Clio Rd., at community outreach events, and through community partners.

In 2023, the OPH accomplished the following:

- * Provided 4,399 water filters and 13,756 refill cartridges to City of Flint residents.
- * In collaboration with the Water Service Center and Water Treatment Plant, conducted outreach to residents whose water tested above the action limit, applied a public health approach to lead service line replacement, and distributed 246 2-bottle water test kits.
- * In collaboration with the Water Service Center, provided outreach to hundreds of residents at risk of having their water shut off.
- * In collaboration with the Department of Community and Business Services, provided public health navigation assistance to residents who needed to get into good standing with the city to be eligible for the Choice Neighborhood Improvement Grant.
- * Provided 896 community resource referrals to 235 residents.

With the \$300,000 received from Opioid Settlement funds in 2023, the OPH increased its capacity to prevent the initiation and delay the onset of substances by youth, employ harm reduction strategies, center racial equity, increase access to treatment and support recovery by executing contracts with recipient organizations, developing partnerships and employing primary prevention strategies.

Opioid Settlement Funds have allowed the OPH to be fully staffed for the first time in two years, resulting in more timely access to Public Health Navigation services, resulting in better access to community services and fewer delays. With adequate staffing, they have been able to extend services to the Clio Road Service Center. Most of the staff have been trained in Naloxone/Narcan administration through Genesee Health System or Wellness Services, with plans to obtain certification for one staff member to conduct trainings. Staff have participated in additional trainings on topics such as a community systems approach to recovery, Xylazine, research on psychedelic compounds for treatment, substance use as a risk factor for gun violence, and how other communities are using their settlement funds. Through her extensive experience and knowledge of primary prevention, the Public Health Manager supports the professional development of the Public Health Navigators in using a public health approach to prevent substance use.

With support from the Michigan State Department of Health and Human Services, both City Hall and Clio Road Service Center have Naloxone/Narcan kits available to the public. The OPH has executed Recipient Agreements with three local service providers, including Donations With Love for prevention, Insight Healthcare Services and Hospital for treatment, and Serenity House Communities for recovery services.

By funding the OPH with Opioid Settlement Funds, the City of Flint has leveraged the following:

- * \$1,000,000 in EPA Environmental Justice funding (acceptance resolution forthcoming)
- * \$75,000 in Community Development Block Grant funding to hire a Public Health Navigation and Housing Specialist for the new Healthy Homes Save Lives program
- * \$3.5 million through a justification for additional Opioid Settlement Funds through the State of Michigan
- * An internship program that has supervised five interns in public health and community health worker programs across the state and beyond

In 2024, the OPH will address the root causes of substance use by improving the social and environmental determinants of health to prevent overdose deaths. The Public Health Manager will continue to serve on the Greater Flint Health Coalition's Mental Health & Substance Use

Task Force and the Genesee County Opioid Fatality Review through the Medical Examiner’s Office. Through partnerships with the Community Violence Intervention and Prevention Initiative, the Sexual Assault Kit Initiative, End Gun Violence Michigan, and the Flint Police Department, the OPH will collaborate toward community-level approaches to reducing violence and the resulting trauma, a major risk factor for substance use. Through external partnerships with the Genesee County Prevention Coalition, the Genesee County Health Department, Genesee Community Corrections, as well as academic and educational partners, the OPH will collaborate toward more effective and efficient use of Opioid Settlement Funds. The staff has met to better coordinate with existing service providers to bring awareness to opioid overdoses on International Opioid Overdose Awareness Day on August 31st, reminding ourselves of the lives lost and bringing more people to treatment, recovery and connection.

Section IV: FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The FY25 budget will increase by \$1,000,000 for Fund 296 Department 704.750, with grant code FEPA-EVG2G24, with the ability to roll over any remaining funds to subsequent fiscal years, until the end of the grant period on May 31, 2027.

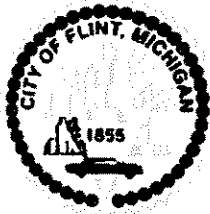

WHEREAS, P.A. 390 of 1994, which amended Section 7u of Act 206 of the Public Acts of 1893, as amended by Act 253 of the Public Acts of 2020, being section 211.7u of the Michigan Compiled Laws, requires the governing body of the assessing unit to determine and make available to the public the policy and guidelines for granting of poverty exemptions under MCL 211.7u;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That to be eligible for consideration of a hardship exemption pursuant to MCL 211.7u in the City of Flint, a person must be the owner and must occupy the property as a principal residence, as defined, for which the exemption is requested; file a complete application, prescribed by the state tax commission; submit copies of federal and state income tax returns for ALL persons that resided in the principal residence including property tax credit forms and/or Statement of Benefits paid from Michigan Department of Social Services or Social Security Administration; and meet City of Flint poverty income standards;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the applicant and ALL qualifying persons that resided in the home must have an annual adjusted income no more than 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines published in the prior calendar year;

The segment of Roberts St subject to the partial vacation petition is a local two-way street located between E. Stewart Ave St and Black Ave, Northwest adjacent to the Flint Commerce Center (Buick City) and is part of the Plat of Maplewood subdivision (see **Exhibit B**).

The character of the proximal area of the subject segment of Roberts Street has transitioned from a traditional residential neighborhood, with adjacent civic, commercial and industrial uses to vacant properties that have been purchased by the Genesee County Landbank for demolition; the Flint Commerce Center (Buick City) is adjacent southeast of the subject segment of Roberts St.

Planning Overview:

The City of Flint (City) is seeking a positive recommendation from the Planning Commission to City Council for approval by resolution, to partially vacate Roberts St, between E Stewart Ave and the North lot lines of Lot 234 (4401 Roberts St) and Lot 285 (4402 Roberts St) of the Plat of Maplewood (see **Exhibits A&B**).

Public access to Roberts St, south from Black Ave, terminating at the North Lot Lines of 4401 & 4402 Roberts St, will remain allowing the property owners of 405 Roberts St, 47-31-183-033 Roberts St, and 914 & 918 Black Ave to access their properties (see Exhibit B).

A staff report is generated and submitted to the Planning Commission summarizing the merits of the application, planning principals, input from various City departments, utility companies, transportation agencies, and any other relevant background information.
- b) Prior to the public hearing, the Planning Commission reviews all application materials, the staff review, and conducts a site visit of the subject site.

5) Planning Commission

- a) During the public hearing portion of the Planning Commission meeting, the applicant has the opportunity to address the Commission regarding the vacation request. In addition, anyone with interest in the case is also given an opportunity to address the Commission, either for or against the requested vacation. The Planning Commission considers all public input prior to rendering a recommendation.
- b) After public comment is given, the Commission will deliberate on the merits of the case and vote on a recommendation to forward to the Flint City Council. The application is then forwarded to City Council with the Planning Commission's recommendation.

6) City Council

- a) The Flint City Council will schedule a public hearing, publish a notice of said public hearing and hold the public hearing at one of their regularly scheduled meetings. The Flint City Council renders the final decision to approve or deny the application for the requested vacation.
- b) A vacation and discontinuance of street, alley, or public ground requires approval of City Council and adoption by Resolution. Should the vacation be approved, the city property shall cease to be part of the city public system and the land will become the property of the adjoining landowner and placed on the assessment rolls for the purpose of taxation. The city may reserve an easement for public utility purposes. It becomes the new owner's responsibility to maintain the property they have acquired.

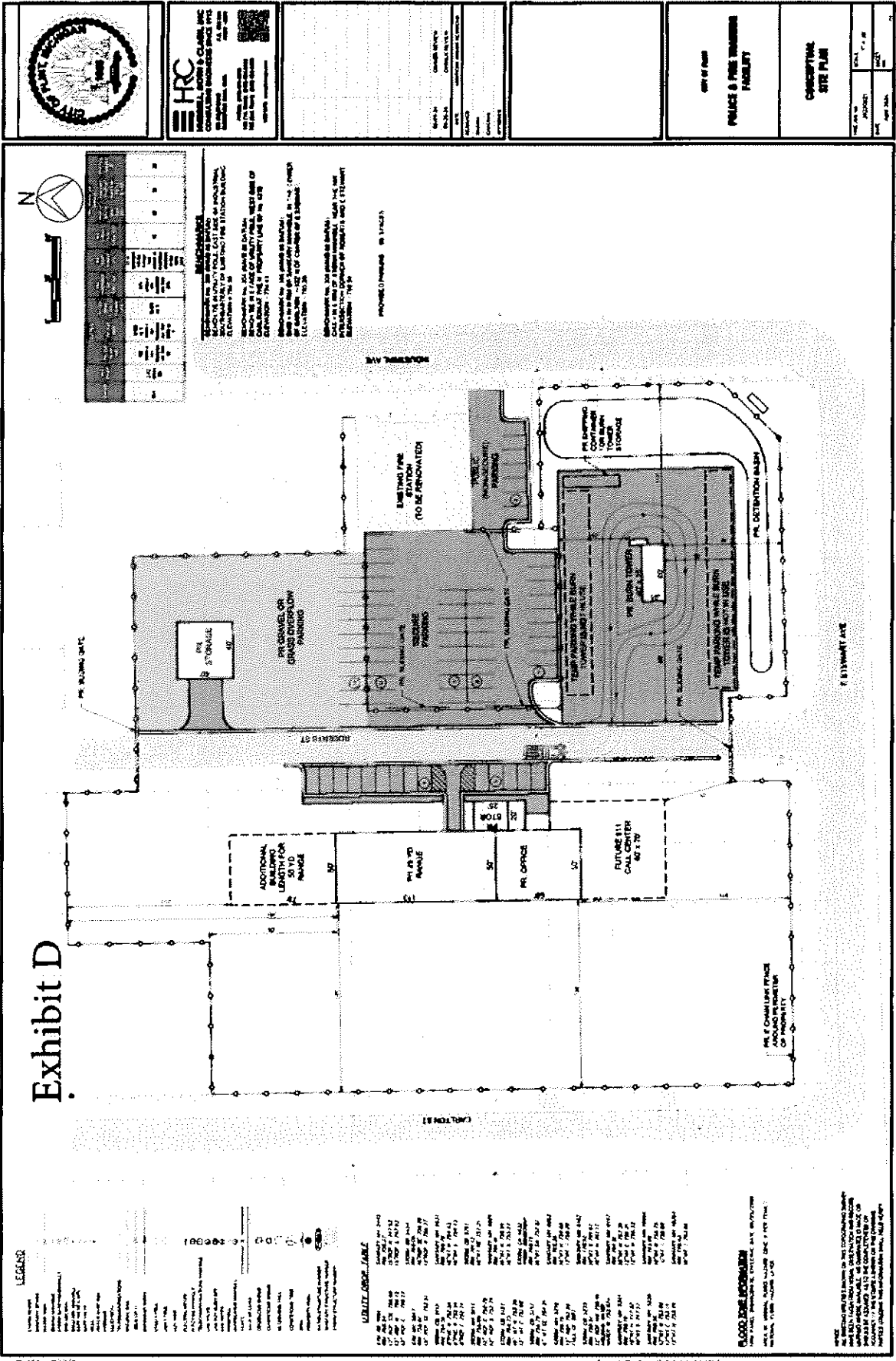

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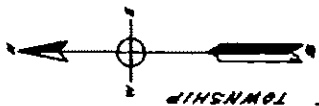

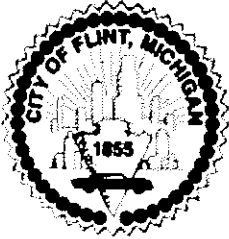

Sec. 1. An Ordinance to amend Chapter 46, Utilities, Article II, Water Supply and Sewage Disposal System, by the addition of Division 5, Replacement of Lead Service Lines, which shall read in its entirety:

DIVISION 5: REPLACEMENT OF LEAD SERVICE LINES

§46-75. Purpose and Definitions.

- (a) Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the removal and replacement of all lead service lines in the City of Flint.
- (b) Definitions. As used in this ordinance the following words shall have the following meaning:
 - (1) *Service Line* shall mean the pipe or conduit located on a parcel of property which connects any building, dwelling or structure in the City of Flint to the City of Flint's public water distribution system.
 - (a) The *private side* of a service line shall mean that portion of the service line which extends from the building, dwelling or structure to the beginning of a public right of way.
 - (b) The *public side* of a service line shall mean that portion of the service line which extends on, under or through a public right of way.
 - (2) *Lead Service Line* shall mean a service line that is made of lead or galvanized steel.
 - (3) *Owner* shall mean any person or entity which holds legal or equitable title to any parcel of property in the City of Flint upon which a service line is located. The term *Owner* shall include the executor, trustee, guardian or receiver of an estate or trust which holds legal or equitable title to a parcel of property, including a mortgagee or vendee in possession.

§46-76. Lead Service Lines Declared a Public Nuisance, Replacement

- (a) The existence of a lead service line or lines in the City of Flint is declared a public nuisance and may be abated as provided by law.

- (b) The absence of City records indicating that the service line was inspected and/or replaced after 2015 at any given property shall create a rebuttable presumption that a lead service line exists at that property.
- (c) A lead service line may be replaced at no expense to the owner of the property under the Lead Service Line Replacement Program as described in §46-77 of this ordinance.

§ 46-77. Lead Service Line Replacement Program

- (a) A Lead Service Line Replacement Program shall be managed by the City of Flint Department of Public Works.
- (b) The Lead Service Line Replacement Program shall replace any lead service line in the City of Flint, at no expense to the owner of the property, on a schedule to be determined by the City.
- (c) To participate in the Lead Service Line Replacement Program, an owner must:
 - (1) Register with the City of Flint Department of Public Works in a form acceptable to the Department of Public Works;
 - (2) Grant the agents, employees and/or contractors of the City of Flint, permission to enter the property upon which the lead service line is located or believed to be located, during any daylight hours, for the purpose of replacing the lead service line.
- (d) Failure of an owner to participate in the Lead Service Line Replacement Program shall constitute a public nuisance subject to abatement.
- (e) The deadlines of this subsection may be extended by the City of Flint Department of Public Works for good cause.

§ 46-78. Violation and Remedies

- (a) An owner who fails to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction as provided under § 1-13 to § 1-20 of the Flint City Code of Ordinances.
- (b) The City attorney for the City of Flint may maintain an action to enforce the provisions of this ordinance and may seek equitable relief to abate any nuisance.
- (c) An owner who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall also be liable for the costs of any action to abate a nuisance under this ordinance, including reasonable attorneys fees, but not including the costs of inspecting and/or replacing a service line.

An Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 31, General Offenses.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF FLINT:

Sec. 1. An Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 31, General Offenses, Article I, In General, by amending ~~and renumbering Section 31-20.3~~ Section 31-16.2, Fireworks, which shall read in its entirety as follows:

§31-16.2. FIREWORKS.

(a) *Definitions.* As used in this section:

APA STANDARD 87-1. 2001 APA standard 87-1, standard for construction and approval for transportation of fireworks, novelties, and theatrical pyrotechnics, published by the American Pyrotechnics Association of Bethesda, Maryland.

ARTICLES PYROTECHNIC. Pyrotechnic devices for professional use that are similar to Consumer Fireworks in chemical composition and construction but not intended for consumer use, that meet the weight limits for Consumer Fireworks but are not labeled as such, and that are classified as UN0431 or UN0432 under 49 CFR 172.101.

CONSUMER FIREWORKS. Fireworks devices that are designed to produce visible effects by combustion, that are required to comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations promulgated by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 CFR Parts 1500 and 1507, and that are listed in APA Standard 87-1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3, OR 3.5. Consumer Fireworks does not include Low-Impact Fireworks.

DISPLAY FIREWORKS. Large fireworks devices that are explosive materials intended for use in fireworks displays and designed to produce visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation, as provided in 27 CFR 555.11, 49 CFR 172, and APA Standard 87-1, 4.1.

FIREWORK OR FIREWORKS. Any composition or device, except for a starting pistol, a flare gun, or a flare, designed for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, deflagration, or detonation. Fireworks consist of Consumer Fireworks, Low-Impact Fireworks, Articles Pyrotechnic, Display Fireworks and special effects.

LOW-IMPACT FIREWORKS. Ground and handheld sparkling devices as that phrase is defined under APA Standard 87-1, 3.1, 3.1.1.1 to 3.1.1.8, AND 3.5.

(b) *Permit for use of fireworks; application; purpose of use; age limitation.*

(1) The Fire Marshal, upon application in writing, on forms provided by the Fire Department, may grant a permit for the use of fireworks otherwise prohibited within the corporate limits, manufactured for public display by municipalities, fair associations, amusement parks, or other organizations or groups of individuals approved by the City, if the applicable provisions of this section are complied with. A permit granted under this subsection shall not be transferable, nor shall a permit be issued to a person under the age of 18 years.

(2) The Fire Marshal, upon application in writing, may grant a permit, on forms provided by the Fire Department, to a resident wholesale dealer or jobber to have in his/her possession

within the corporate limits. A permit granted under this subsection is not transferable, nor shall a permit be issued to a person under the age of 18 years.

(3) Before a permit for a pyrotechnic display is issued, the person, firm, or corporation making application shall furnish proof of financial responsibility by a bond or insurance in an amount deemed necessary by the Fire Marshal to satisfy claims for damages to property or personal injuries arising out of an act or omission on the part of the person, firm, or corporation, or an agent or employee thereof, in the amount, character, and form the Fire Marshal determines necessary for the protection of the public.

(4) A permit shall not be issued to a nonresident person, firm, or corporation for conduct of a pyrotechnic display in this State until the person, firm, or corporation has appointed in writing a resident member of the bar of this State or a resident agent to be his legal representative upon whom all process in an action or proceeding against him may be served.

(5) The Fire Marshal shall rule on the competency and qualifications of operators of pyrotechnic displays, as the operator has furnished in his application form, and on the time, place, and safety aspects of the displays before granting permits.

(c) *Use of Consumer Fireworks.*

(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) and (3) below, it shall be unlawful for any person to ignite, discharge or use Consumer Fireworks, as that term is defined in section (a).

~~(2) A Person may ignite, discharge or use Consumer Fireworks between the hours of 8:00am and midnight on the day preceding, the day of, and the day after the following national holidays:~~

~~Martin Luther King, Jr. day, the 3rd Monday in January;~~

~~Washington's Birthday, the 3rd Monday in February;~~

~~Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;~~

~~Independence Day, July 4;~~

~~Labor Day, the 1st Monday in September;~~

~~Columbus Day, the 2nd Monday in October;~~

~~Veterans Day, November 11;~~

~~Thanksgiving Day, the 4th Thursday in November; and,~~

~~Christmas Day, December 25.~~

(2) A Person may ignite, discharge, or use Consumer Fireworks after 11:00am on the following days:

(i) December 31 until 1:00am on January 1.

(ii) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day until 11:45pm on each of those days.

(iii) June 29 to July 4 until 11:45pm on each of those days.

(iv) July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday until 11:45pm.

(v) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45pm on each of those days.

~~(3) On New Year's Day, January 1, a Person may ignite, discharge or use Consumer Fireworks between the hours of 8:00am and 1:00am. On the day before and the day after New Year's Day, a Person may ignite, discharge or use Consumer Fireworks between the hours of 8:00am and midnight.~~

(4)(3) A Person shall not ignite, discharge, or use Consumer Fireworks on Public Property, school property, church property, or the property of another Person without the organization's or Person's express permission to use those Consumer Fireworks on those premises. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a Person that violates this subsection is responsible for a civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

~~(5)(4)~~ Consumer Fireworks shall not be ignited, discharged or used by a Person under the influence of Alcoholic Liquor or Controlled Substances or a combination of both.

~~(6)(5)~~ Low-Impact Fireworks shall not be ignited, discharged or used by a Person under the influence of Alcoholic Liquor or Controlled Substances or a combination of both.

(d) *Penalty provisions for violation.*

(1) Any Person who is in violation of this section is responsible for a civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each violation.

(e) *Severability.*

The various parts, sections and clauses of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected.
