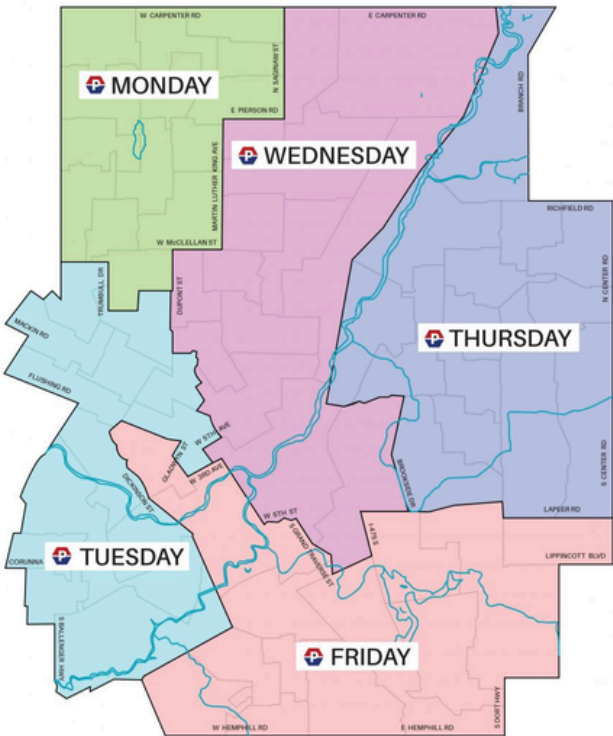

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- **Q: How far apart do my trash and recycling carts need to be away from each other?**
 - 3 ft. away from each other
- **Q: Can I set out bulk items on my pickup day?**
 - Up to 3 bulk items are allowed per week and up to 20 bags per week. No special pickup needed.
- **Q: Are trash and recycling picked up on different days?**
 - Trash & recycling are all picked up on the same service day.

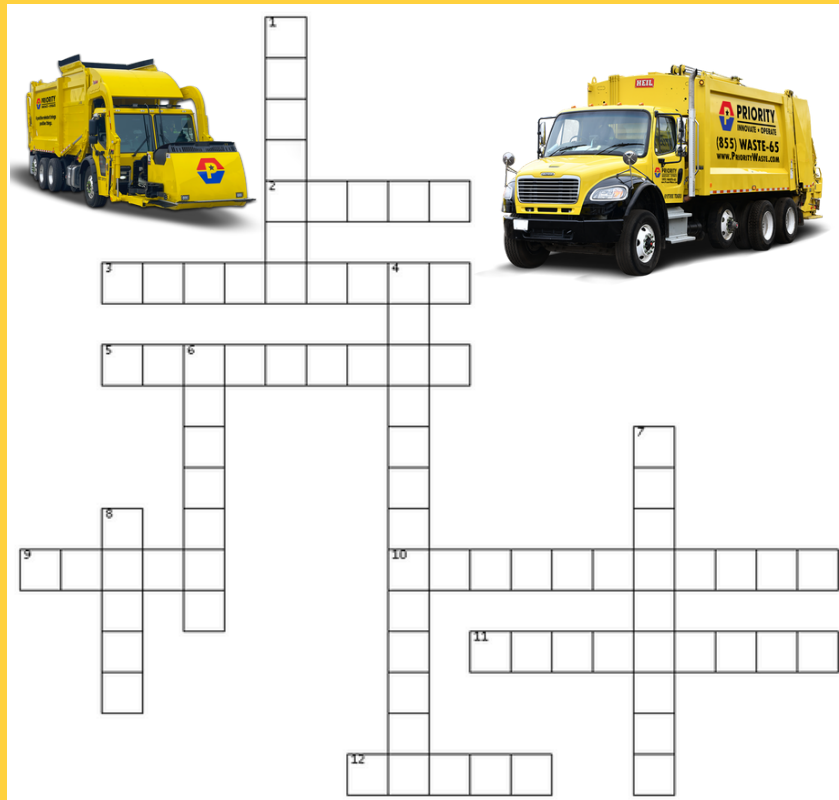

HINTS & ANSWERS ON THE SUSTAINABILITY PAGE

Priority's Sustainability Guide

Some communities rules and guidelines may vary



RECYCLING All material should be placed loose in the recycling cart.



Paper Products

Newspaper, office paper, magazines, junk mail, clean pizza boxes and cardboard/paperboard boxes broken down.



Metal

Aluminum, steel and tin cans – empty and rinsed.



Glass

Clear and colored bottles and jars – empty and rinsed, can leave lids on.



Plastics

Bottles, jugs and containers/tubs – empty and rinsed with caps/lids on. Examples: water/pop bottles, milk jugs and detergent containers, the containers would be like butter tubs, yogurt, sour cream, cottage cheese, etc.



Consumer Packaging

Egg cartons, broth containers, coffee cups, milk cartons – empty and rinsed.



No Electronics or E-Waste

E-waste, which includes discarded electronics like computers and mobile phones, is not recyclable through regular curbside programs and should be taken to an E-waste recycling center or local government facility for proper disposal

TRASH All materials should be bagged properly COMPOST Must be placed in a brown bag or designated cart.



Not sure if it is recyclable? Throw it away.

Non recyclable items can damage and slow down the recycling process. If you are unsure. Throw it away.

 Frequently asked items: Pizza Boxes, plastic bags, food contaminated materials, ceramics and more.



Leaves, twigs, branches, grass clippings, and plants.

If you have long branches they must be under 3 feet in length and bundled with twine.



NO Animal Waste Food Waste

Animal and food waste should be kept out of the compost bin to prevent attracting pests and creating unpleasant odors, as they do not decompose in the same way as regular yard waste.

Bring your batteries to a recycling center near you or ask your local government to learn more.
